DRAPERS WINDMILL

Drapers Windmill, St. Peters Footpath, CT9 2SP draperswindmill.org.uk

Windmill Trust had restored the mill by 1975.

Dickens House Museum is housed in the cottage that was Charles Dickens' inspiration for the home of Betsey Trotwood in David Copperfield.

Visitors will see items that belonged to Dickens including letters about Broadstairs, his writing box, mahogany sideboard and a fine collection of prints by H K Browne (Phiz), one of Dickens' principal illustrators. There are displays of Dickensian memorabilia, Victorian costumes and Victoriana, plus a feature on "Our English Watering Place". It was in 1851 that Charles Dickens wrote this affectionate record of the town and its inhabitants.

The museum is split across two levels.

Built in 1785 as a private residence, Pierremont Hall has been home to many and is now open to the community for public and private events.

Discover some of the secrets of this newly renovated Grade II listed building. The Hall was built in 1785 for Thomas Forsyth and designed by Samuel Pepys Cockerell. The Duchess of Kent and a young Princess Victoria holidayed at Pierremont from 1826 to 1836. It had various owners until its sale in 1896 to Leonard Posnett, who used it as a school. Most of the original 30 acres of land were developed as housing, and the building and remaining park were sold to the Urban District Council

This will not be a guided tour - visitors will be allowed access to the ground floor only - a leaflet of the history of Pierremont will be available.

Explore the church at your leisure – highlights include the Dunkirk window and Grade II Listed organ, built by famous organ maker, William Hill. Guided tours up the lantern tower and into the crypt. Climb the tower (141 steps to the top) to see all over Ramsgate and on a clear day, France. The climb is unsuitable for under 8's children under 12 must be escorted by an adult due to steep stairs. In the crypt, you will see where the first Mayor of Ramsgate is buried and where church services were held during the Second World War.

Tours are free on Heritage Open Days but donations towards the restoration of the church are gratefully received.

There is no parking available on site. Disabled toilets are available in the Church Hall adjacent to the Church.

POWELL-COTTON MUSEUM, OUEX HOUSE AND GARDENS

Quex House was built in 1812, and many of the passions and interests of its builder John Powell-Powell can still be seen today, including a collection of Napoleonic memorabilia, a collection of naval cannons and the distinctive boat-shaped curve to two of the publicly accessible rooms.

The house has been extensively remodelled in its lifetime, with the current layout largely reflecting the life of Percy Powell-Cotton and his family, who lived in the house in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Percy is perhaps best known as the founder of the Powell-Cotton Museum and an explorer, with his travels and enthusiasm for collecting reflected in the house. Many international influences can be found in the Drawing Room, for example, which features a beautiful papier mache ceiling decorated in a Persian-style pattern.

Quex Gardens span 7 acres, enjoy a woodland walk, a walled kitchen garden, a croquet lawn, beautiful borders, and an ornamental fountain.

New for 2025! View the refreshed gallery interpretation in galleries 1, 2 and 3 featuring new stories and facts about natural history and redisplays of objects and photos from Kenya, Uganda, South Sudan and Ethiopia.
